Back-to-School Activities Planned

On Wednesday, August 30th, our parents and students are invited to **Back-To-School Night**. Classrooms in both schools will be open from 4 to 6pm. This is an opportunity for students and parents to come in, meet their teacher(s), bring in their school supplies, and finish any registration papers prior to the start of school. Secondary school students can pick up their schedules and find their classrooms, while elementary students can unpack their new supplies.

Bus Lamers Line will be contacting parents to let them know pick-up and drop-off times prior to school starting. If you have questions about bussing, Lamers can be contacted directly at 920-590-0623. Α representative will also be available at Summer Splash.



On Tuesday, August 15th from 10am to 4 pm, there will be a walk in scheduling day with Mrs. Parker for all **High School** students. This is a first come, first serve time where high school students can come to the Guidance room to change their schedule. Schedules will not be changed after the third day of school, so meeting with Mrs. Parker about a schedule concern would be a great opportunity to plan for the 2017/18 school year.

Incoming **Freshmen** and their parents are encouraged to schedule a Transition Meeting with Mrs. Parker on August 16th, 23rd, or 24th. At these meetings students, parents, and Mrs. Parker will discuss

individual's academic career plan and transition to high school. Notes were mailed to families with more information on these meetings. Please contact Mrs. Wocking in the Secondary School office to schedule a time.

Sixth Grade students and parents are invited to a special orientation session on August 30th starting at 3:30pm in the Middle School. This meeting is to give students and parents transitioning between buildings time to check out the building, meet the teachers, and learn more about the changes they can expect from Grade School to Middle School. They will also be given time to practice necessary Secondary School skills, like opening combination locks.

Grading Changes Coming to Both Buildings

For the upcoming school year, there will be some changes to when parents receive grading reports. In the past, both schools ran on a traditional quarter format. For the 2017-18 school year, the Elementary School will move to trimesters, while the



Secondary School will change to a semester format.

At the Elementary School, there will be three trimester report cards sent home. Parents will also receive progress reports at the midpoint of each trimester. This allows teachers to get

enough data and information to report on in some classes, as well as lining up with the intervention cycles.

At the Secondary School, there will be two semester report cards sent home. Instead of quarterly report cards, two progress reports will be sent out during each semester to keep parent apprised of students' progress. Parents are also encouraged to use the school's Infinite Campus Parent Portal to check student's grades at any point during the semester. This change better aligns with the final transcripts students receive upon graduation.

Summer School Keeps Kids Engaged in Learning

For six weeks of summer, the schools were buzzing with the sounds of students learning and exploring. There were 311 students that participated in at least one week of summer school this year. In an average week there were about 220 students, so many students choose to come in for multiple weeks. Over 25 teachers came up with units to

offer students that included woodworking, Harry Potter, work outs, random acts of kindness, scrapbooking, and touring Gillett along with remedial classes to catch students up or make sure they don't experience a huge "summer slide."

This program included free breakfast and lunch for all students.

Community children under the age of 18 could eat even if they weren't in summer school. On a typical day, 125 students ate at school. The food program is paid for through a state funded summer food grant, helping the students and the community.

Academic and Career Planning at Gillett School District

Starting this fall, all Gillett Secondary students will participate in an Academic and Career Planning, or ACP, program. ACP is a student-driven, adult-supported process in which students create and cultivate their own unique and information-based visions for postsecondary success. They will obtain this vision through self-exploration, career exploration, and the development of career management and planning skills. Beginning with the Career Cruising Exploratory in middle school that focuses on the Academic, Personal/Social, and Career domains and ending with the successful completion of a portfolio by the time they graduate, students will better prepare themselves for their future.

Four stages make the ACP process successful:

- Who am I? Students begin to get to know their interests, skills, and strengths as early as sixth grade.
- Where do I want to go? Students explore career pathways and educational opportunities. During high school, students are guided through the planning process.
- How do I get there? Students set goals and choose specific courses to guide them. They will also be given opportunities to write resumes and fill out job applications.
- GO! This allows students to showcase their portfolios and academic work.

The goal of the program is to produce responsible Gillett High School graduates who will begin their adult lives with knowledge, skills, motivation, and a self-directed plan for career and life long success.

Free & Reduced Meal Information

Each year, nearly half of our families qualify for help with the cost of school meals. Not only does this help our families, but it helps our schools. There are several opportunities for grants and aid that the school is able to take advantage of based on the number of students that qualify for free and reduced meals.

Free & Reduced Meal Benefit Applications will be available at both schools, on the website, and in the District Office. Please complete the confidential application if you feel your household meets the criteria. Please return the completed application to any Gillett School office. The sooner the application is returned, the faster the application will be processed, however, you can apply at any time during the school year. Applications do expire. Each October, any eligibility from the previous school year will expire unless you have already successfully completed a new application form. It is important to submit a new application each year.

If you receive a letter in the mail in August 2017 indicating you have qualified for free meals through State benefits, **do not complete the application**. Please read the letter that was sent if any school age children in your household were **not listed** on your notification letter. Contact the Food Service Coordinator, Julie Temple, (920) 855-2119 ext 5504, as they may be eligible.

Only one application per household is needed. All directions are listed on the free and reduced meal form to assist in the process. We cannot approve an application that is not complete; so please be sure to fill out ALL required information. Incomplete applications will not be processed. Any debt incurred during the processing time is the responsibility of the household. If you have questions or need any assistance in filling out the free and reduced application please contact the Food Service Coordinator, Julie Temple, (920) 855-2119 ext 5504.
