

Help Offered Preparing for Post High School Education

On November 2nd, Gillett High School has some great opportunities for students to get help with some post high school options. From 2-3:30, the NWTC Career Coach, Connie Jordan, and Mrs Parker, Guidance Counselor, will be offering the seniors the chance to take the Accuplacer test for FREE. The signup sheet is on the window outside the guidance office. Student will need his/her social security number. From 4-6 pm, Connie will be available to help students complete an NWTC college application and submit it for FREE. Also, from 6-7 pm, an NWTC Financial Aid expert will discuss the FASFA, the Free Application for Federal Student Aid, and other scholarship opportunities.

Even if you can't dodge as well as you use to, spectators are encouraged to come


and support the players and the NHS's Christmas for Kids. Concessions will be available for purchase.

What's New at the Elementary School?

The school year is just cruising along at Gillett Elementary! There's always a lot happening in the classroom, but there's also a lot that goes on behind the scenes. Let's learn a little bit about some of them and answer some of your questions about schools today.

They Blinded Me With Science!

The introduction of the Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) has "upped the a larger focus on exposing students to engineering and other STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) areas. For years, we have met our science needs with the great hands-on units provided by the Einstein Project in Green Bay. Instead of using textbooks and reading about science, student learning about sound create their own musical instruments and study how sound waves work. Instead of watching a movie about ecosystems, students create their own living aquarium and terrarium, complete with live



critters, and examine the impact of disruptions to a living environment.

Next school year, Gillett Elementary will be one of the first schools in the area to pioneer the new Einstein Units fully aligned with the NGSS, co-written by the Smithsonian Institute. Teachers will be trained this year,

while still teaching our present units to our students. With all of the changes in education, hands-on learning and science will never go out of style.

The Future Is Now

You may have heard of Academic Career Planning, or ACP, a new initiative at the middle and high school level. While Gillett Elementary doesn't officially use ACP, it doesn't mean we're not actively training our students for life after schooling.

This past spring, Junior Achievement and Huntington Bank joined forces to provide our students in grades 2-4 a program called "JA in a Day", a full day of active learning about business, personal financial responsibility, and entrepreneurship. The lessons and volunteers don't come cheaply, and the good people at Huntington Bank provided both for us through their gracious donation of support and their own personal time in our classrooms.

In fifth grade, our teachers are busily instructing Junior Achievement's Biztown curriculum. This intensive program brings what students have learned in grades 2-4 to highly practical levels. As a culmination of these lessons, the fifth grade will travel to Milwaukee on December

12 to spend a day immersed in their learning at the JA BizTown Facility, where students will live out a day running businesses with the help of experienced adults. It's an amazing experience that we hope to continue as an ongoing tradition at Gillett Elementary School.
